New Rules!

- 1. Each teacher will be asked to pay a \$10 teacher fee the first time she accesses the <u>scjbf.org</u>student registration system. This \$10 fee will cover all students of that teacher. This money will be used to defray costs for programming, website hosting and software upgrades required for the maintenance of the <u>scjbf.org</u> website. The teacher fee for CWA is being eliminated.
- 2. Beginning with the 2018 Branch Festivals, judges will be asked to select 50% of students playing eligible repertoire to advance to the regional festival, **under the condition that the student has a cumulative score of at least 270.** (270 represents an average of 90 from each judge.) Please begin to publicize this at all of your branch events.

Branch rules:

- 1) No Anna Magdalena pieces.
- 2) Requests are limited to AM or PM with valid reasons.
- 3) Students who fail to attend their assigned recitals are subject to disqualification.
- 4) Teachers who enter students are expected to work on the festival day. If you cannot work on the festival day, you will need to send in a substitute.

Reminders:

- PRINT OUT YOUR STUDENT LIST. Check that all students were successfully registered. If any of your students' names do not appear on this list, their registrations are not complete.
- Delete all students who are not participating this year.
- The Regional Festival is on May 19, 2018. Each performer will pay \$12 to cover the cost of regional registration.

Violin Masterclass with Lorenz Gamma Saturday February 10th 1:30-2:00

Violinist Lorenz Gamma has a varied career as soloist, recitalist, chamber musician and teacher. He spent three years touring with the Amar Quartet, with performances in many of Europe's most important chamber music venues, including the Tonhalle in Zurich, the Victoria Hall in Geneva, the Residenz in Munich, the Cologne Philharmonic, as well as many other venues in cities such as London, Paris, New York etc. With his quartet he won the Millennium Award at the London International String Quartet Competition, the national

Migros Prize of Switzerland, as well as the Second Prize and Special Audience Award at the International String Quartet Competition in Graz, Austria in 2000.

Prior to his activity with the quartet, Mr. Gamma served as concertmaster of the Northwest Sinfonietta in Seattle and as principal of the Zurich Opera orchestra. As a soloist Mr. Gamma has performed over twenty different concertos by Bach, Beethoven, Berg, Brahms, Bruch, Gubaidulina, Lutoslawski, Mozart, Mendelssohn, Piazzolla, Rubinstein, Schumann, Spohr, Tartini, Vivaldi, and Wieniawski. As a chamber musician he has performed string quartets by over fifty composers, as well as the greater part of the standard chamber literature of over eighty composers. Musicians he collaborated with include Sophia Gubaidulina, Heinz Holliger, Paul Katz, Ronald Leonard, Thea Musgrave, Roger Reynolds, Donald McInnes, Joseph Silverstein, Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi and many others.

Mr. Gamma lives in Los Angeles, is professor of violin and head of string studies at California State University Northridge and has previously taught at UCLA, the California Institute of the Arts, Indiana University in Bloomington and UC Santa Barbara. His private and professional violin students have regularly gone on to continue their studies at such institutions as the Juilliard School, Indiana University, the Manhattan and Eastman Schools of Music, the Cleveland Institute of Music, University of Southern California and the Colburn School in Los Angeles.

Cello Masterclass with Diane Roscetti 2:00-4:00

Diane Roscetti, Professor of Cello, Chamber Music and Entrepreneurship, at CSUN also serves as Graduate Coordinator, String Area Co-Coordinator and Director of the Samuel Goldberg Honors String Quartet Program. Prior to coming to CSUN she was Director of the School of Performing Arts at the University of Maine. She is actively involved in designing creative and cost-effective ways to expand entrepreneurial programming.

Professor Roscetti started an advanced graduate string quartet program at the University of Maine with members of that program performing at Lincoln Center, Coleman Chamber Competition in Pasadena, CA, and doing extensive outreach in the northeast. At CSUN she is the Director of the Samuel Goldberg Honors String Quartet Program which is generously funded by the Samuel Goldberg Foundation in NYC. As a cellist, she has enjoyed many summers performing chamber music at the Algonquin International Music Festival in Canada, the Silver Bay Summer Music Festival in Lake George, NY, the Arcady Music Festival in Maine, the Beverly Hills International Music Festival, and many others. As a soloist, she has performed on both Maine Public Television and Radio, as well as doing exchange recitals with other universities. A Colorado native, Professor Roscetti received her high school diploma from the Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan, and did her undergraduate and graduate work in cello performance at Oberlin Conservatory, New England Conservatory and Northern Illinois University.

Professor Roscetti works extensively with guest speakers and artists from many different areas of the Los Angeles music industry, and enjoys bringing the many different facets of career possibilities to students working towards careers in music and the arts.
