Promote the performance of Contemporary style works of the last 100 years. The composer must have been living at sometime during the last 100 years and must exhibit 20th-21st century compositional techniques, including, pointilism, serialism, modes and contrived scales, polyrhythm, polytonality, etc.

Thousand Oaks Philharmonic Concerto Competition



GENERAL OVERVIEW

- an opportunity for excellent students to perform with the Thousand Oaks Philharmonic
- Repertoire must be a standard concerto or a concert piece or aria (for vocalists) for soloist & orchestra. Unusual or questionable repertoire should be cleared in advance with T.O. Phil (contact OrnelaErvin@verizon.net)

CONEJO VALLEY SPECIFICS

- All students auditioning must also be members of the TOPhilharmonic's pre-college conservatory training program called "Appassionata!" The registration fee for "Appassionata!" includes all master classes, lectures, workshops and their highly successful Gold Recital Series, which gives all participating students added performance opportunities throughout the year. The optional audition to be considered for a concerto solo spot is also covered in the registration fee. Enrollment into the Appassionata program is available online at www.tophil.org
- If no masterclasses are offered for a specific instrument (i.e., French horn, clarinet, voice, trumpet, etc) the student will be given the option to simply pay the \$50 audition fee, and then if invited, asked for the same contribution as all other invited soloists.
- Winners and invited soloists get 2 rehearsals and 2 performances with the professional orchestra and conductor.
- Even though the local MTAC branch covers a small amount for winning entrants from the branch, the T.O.Philharmonic performance opportunity is actually valued at more than \$4000. This is a substantial performance award. All invited soloists are asked to contribute \$800 to help with the considerable costs incurred when hiring a professional orchestra. The TOPhil board works tirelessly throughout the year to fundraise and provide additional scholarships to help further reduce this contribution amount. Awards from \$100-\$300 are generously rewarded depending upon the success of annual fundraising activities. In 2016, 22 such awards were given.

Thousand Oaks Philharmonic's "Appassionata!" program

Registration for the Thousand Oaks Philharmonic's "Appassionata!" program is up and running on the organization's website: <u>www.tophil.org</u>

This year, the registration cost has been standardized for each discipline. String students have a yearly tuition of \$250, and for all pianists: \$300.

Master classes for strings are held 2-3 times for the session, and pianists meet each month. Occasional lectures and the Gold Recital Series are all important parts of the program. All students are encouraged to volunteer for the recitals which take place at various retirement communities (you do earn community service hours), libraries and other suitable locations where adequate instruments are available. The TOPhil covers the cost of an accompanist for instrumentalists at the performances. The audition for solo concerto opportunities is also covered in the tuition cost, and this year, the auditions will take place on November 10. Vocalists and instrumentalists are encouraged to audition as well. Interest from students in these categories has not been as strong as violin and piano, so no classes are scheduled until they register in sufficient numbers, but they may audition on Nov. 10 and register with an audition fee of \$50. Master classes for pianists are part of the "Hammered! Honors Master Class Seminar," which usually take place at the Hillcrest Center for the Arts in Thousand Oaks. The schedule is being worked on now, hoping to alternate between Saturday/Sunday to mitigate the conflict of religious Sabbath observations. We are even trying to schedule some Saturday evening classes to avoid conflict.

Dr. Michael Hart, Tuba

Dr. Michael D. Hart currently serves as Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Music at California Lutheran University. At Cal Lutheran, he conducts the Wind Ensemble, provides lessons to all trombone, euphonium and tuba students, teaches courses in music theory, ear training, and music education, and advises and oversees the Music Education curriculum.

Dr. Keum Hwa Cha, Violin

Dr. Keum Hwa Cha is a graduate of both The New England Conservatory of Music, and The Eastman School of Music. She is also a violist, and she has given numerous concerts as a soloist, chamber musician and concertmaster in the United States and in South Korea. Dr. Cha taught at Idaho State University as an Assistant Professor of Music.

Fredric Beerstein, Oboe

Fredric Beerstein, is the oboe instructor at California Lutheran University.
