ASCAP Submissions: Do the Right Thing.

Did you know that US Copyright Law states that composers must receive a royalty when their work is performed? ASCAP protects the rights of its members by licensing and distributing royalties for the performances of copyrighted works.

ASCAP members make their living writing music, many of whom are also MTAC members. ASCAP exists to ensure that music creators are paid when their works are performed publicly. Rental or purchase of sheet music does not authorize its public performance.

MTAC has an ASCAP Copyright License, and covers each and every MTAC member for all branch and individual performances. However, in order for ASCAP members to receive royalties from the performances of their works, we must submit programs to the state office. This is where I need your help.

Throughout the 2019-2020 season, I'll collect TWO copies of each program and send them to the MTAC state office on June 30. As a reminder, these can be studio recitals, masterclasses, festival, and any other performances.

For the convenience of our branch members, there are several ways to submit your programs:

- 1. Send them to or drop them off at my home: Caitlin Boruch, 1258 Rotella Street in Newbury Park, CA 91320.
- 2. Give them to me if you see me in any capacity (MTAC festivals, performances, around town). It is the responsibility of the festival chairs to turn in the programs, but at the festivals where my students perform, I'm happy to arrange to pick up the two copies of every performance.
- 3. Collect them throughout the season and hand them to me at the MTAC luncheon and general meeting in May.

Volunteer Opportunity at Yerba Mansa Meadow

Come help restore native habitat in Rancho Sierra Vista Saturday December 7th from 9am to noon.

The Yerba Mansa Meadow restoration project seeks to restore/enhance approximately 10.8 acres of wetland, riparian and upland habitat through invasive species removal and revegetation with native plants. This meadow is a good example of an ephemeral wetland that has yerba mansa as a dominant species, and this is somewhat uncommon.

This project aims to restore native habitat, and to improve habitat for bird roosting and nesting by introducing native plants that provide a variety of food sources. We will also improve the natural appearance of the wetlands.


Native species for this project include species known to occur in and around wetland areas (yerba mansa, mugwort, spreading rush, mule fat, golden current, deer grass, giant wild rye) and common coastal sage scrub species (purple sage, California buckwheat, California sagebrush, elderberry).

Wear hiking attire, bring water/resuable water bottle, sunscreen, and a sun hat.

Dear Teachers,

The **VOCE Application Portal** will open on **November 1**, **2019**. Refer to the **VOCE Guidelines** found on your Teacher Portal for information about important dates, categories and eligibility requirements.

This year, the application period dates have changed, so please review the deadlines below.

Enrollment Period:

The VOCE enrollment period is from **November 1** to **December 1**, **2019**. No applications can be created after **December 1**, **at 11:59 P.M.** You will be able to make edits to applications up until **December 15**, **2019**.

You can add a student to your Student Roster at this time. Once the student is added to your roster, you can create the VOCE application.

Proof of Age:

MTAC requires proof of age of the student to be provided by the parent (or student if over 18) by **November 1, 2019**.(*editor note-this date must be a mistake. It may be accepted until the close of edits Dec.15?*) Since VOCE has different age divisions, the ages of all participants must be submitted and verified before the deadline. Click here to see more information about the verification process.

Payment Period:

Parents are able to make a payment once the application is created and the age has been verified. The deadline to make the payment is **December 15, 2019.** (**Don't make the payment until thew application is complete**)

A Note about Arias:

Please note that Arias will not be permitted in the Intermediate Age Division for Solo Voice performers. Review the VOCE guidelines to see the full Solo Voice repertoire requirements.

For additional help please contact your VOCE Branch Chair or Branch President.

If your Branch does not host its own audition, the VOCE State Chairs, **Tina Yoo**, VOCE State Chair South, or **Kathy You Wilson**, VOCE State Chair North, will help your Branch coordinate with a neighboring Branch to host an audition.
