President's Greeting

Dear MTAC Colleagues,

Thank you for giving me opportunity to serve as your president for the upcoming term. It is an honor. Past presidents Susan Mastrolonardo, Carol Lancaster, Kim Munday, and Edward Francis and so many others have laid a firm foundation for our fine branch. I am humbled to be a part of this group. I also want to express my appreciation for our current Board Members, Program Chairs and special assistants. You each inspire me with your dedication to your students, to your art, to your community and to this organization.

I hope each of you found some rest and refreshment during these summer months. Brent and I went on a two week road trip to NoCal and Montana. We enjoyed visiting all of our grandchildren and saw some beautiful country, but it was also nice to get back home again. Our shelter-in-place project in the spring was taking out the grass in our little backyard and putting in a garden, so we returned home in August to ripe tomatoes, giant zucchini and emerging Monarch butterflies.

Now all my students have returned and we are pressing forward into the new school year. In the midst of so many changes, I'm grateful for my enduring relationships with my students and I hope that their music lessons provide a stability and continuity in their lives as well.

As you will see in the newsletter, both our Contemporary Festivals will be using recorded videos this year. In recent weeks, I have been asking each of my students to begin recording a few of their pieces. I'm finding that as my students are recording their pieces, they are developing their listening and critiquing skills. Recording can be a valuable teaching tool!

Also in the newsletter, you will note there is a Parent Consent Waiver form that we received from the State. It is necessary for teachers to have each student fill out this form before the student can participate in any of our online programs- live or prerecorded. Each teacher should retain the signed consent forms in their own files.

Finally, the State has informed us that we will be able to have Certificate of Merit this coming year, but it will be carried out differently. Plans are still being developed but here is what we know thus far:

- Instead of an in-person CM training meeting (which we usually have during our September meeting), the CM Council has created an online training video and quiz. This will be open starting September 15. More details to follow.
- 2. The State will determine the dates of our CM evaluations. For that reason, everything on our calendar related to CM testing says "To Be Determined."
- 3. CM will be online. I will keep you informed as new information comes my way.

When I worked as a choir accompanist, I kept a little "Gumby" on top of my piano. It reminded me to try to be ready for whatever changes the director may chose to make at that particular rehearsal. I knew there would be changes, but I didn't know where or when or how much. Perhaps our training as musicians is helping us be flexible as we continue to learn to rapidly adapt to changes that are beyond our control. I'm happy to be in this adventure with you.

I hope that we will continue to serve and support one another well as we navigate through the coming days. I look forward to seeing each of you on Zoom on September 24. Semper Gumby!



ASCAP Submissions: Do the Right Thing.

Did you know that US Copyright Law states that composers must receive a royalty when their work is performed? ASCAP protects the rights of its members by licensing and distributing royalties for the performances of copyrighted works.

ASCAP members make their living writing music, many of whom are also MTAC members. ASCAP exists to ensure that music creators are paid when their works are performed publicly. Rental or purchase of sheet music does not authorize its public performance.

MTAC has an ASCAP Copyright License, and covers each and every MTAC member for all branch and individual performances. However, in order for ASCAP members to receive royalties from the performances of their works, we must submit programs to the state office. This is where I need your help.

Throughout the 2020-2021 season, I'll collect TWO copies of each program and send them to the MTAC state office on June 30. As a reminder, these can be studio recitals, masterclasses, festival, and any other performances.

For the convenience of our branch members, there are several ways to submit your programs:

- 1. Send them to or drop them off at my home: Caitlin Boruch, 1258 Rotella Street in Newbury Park, CA 91320.
- 2. Give them to me if you see me in any capacity (MTAC festivals, performances, around town). It is the responsibility of the festival chairs to turn in the programs, but at the festivals where my students perform, I'm happy to arrange to pick up the two copies of every performance.
- 3. Collect them throughout the season and hand them to me at the MTAC luncheon and general meeting in May.
- 4. Email them in PDF format to caitlinwb@gmail.com

Thank you for your help in ensuring our composers collect the income they have earned.

Registration for the 2020 Women

Composers Festival is now open! The date is Sunday September 20. This year

of course the festival will have to be online. We will be doing it in real time using Zoom or Google Meet.

This festival is open to students of all instruments and voice, and all levels. Chamber music as well as solo pieces are welcome.

The only requirement is that the piece(s) be written by a woman composer. Students will introduce the composer of their piece before they perform it. Three to four sentences are enough, but more is fine too. Teachers should of course vet what the student will say as well as what they will play. Memorization is optional. There is no time limit for pieces. Students may perform with a pre-recorded accompaniment if all participants ("the audience") can hear both parts together.

Students should not perform only their part to a piece if there is supposed to be piano accompaniment, as we were allowed to do for CM. The deadline for applications is September 8. Please do not email your student's' information. Instead, send it through the U.S. Mail to

Please also include your name, email address, and phone number in the mailing. It's probably easiest to put the info for all your students in one envelope, but if they come separately that's fine too.

The fee for this festival this year is \$8 per student, which will be payable through our website. That's not set up yet, so don't try to pay yet.

Please remember—DO NOT email me your students' information. Send it through the postal service. Believe it or not, this will make it a lot easier for me this year.

Guidelines for Video Recording

- Performers are required to dress in formal recital attire to show respect to the occasion and the judges.
- Camera should provide a clear view of the performer, with their hands on the keyboard, and their body from head to toe. It is important for the judges to see pedal techniques of pianists.
- No editing is allowed. Video must be of one single take from start to finish of the music piece(s).
 Instructions for Video Submission
 - 1) YouTube upload (Students' responsibility)
- Students/Teachers are responsible to upload the finished videos onto YouTube on or before the deadline (Oct 21,2020 at 11:59 pm). No late submission will be accepted.
- Description of video: please include ONLY the name of the music piece and the name of composer. DO NOT include student's name.
- Make sure the recording is audible and the video is clear on YouTube.
- Once a link is created for the video, student should forward the link to his/her teacher.

2) Information submission to Emily Wu at emywu15@gmail.com (Teachers' responsibility)

- Once the teacher has collected video links from ALL participating students, please send Emily Wu the students' information, including:
 - o Student's name o Student's level o YouTube link
- A signed Parent Consent/Waiver Form is required for every student. (Teachers are recommended to keep a copy of the signed waiver form of all the students at his/her studio. The form can be reused through the school year for various festivals/programs.)
- Deadline for Information Submission: Oct 22, 2020 at noon.
