ASCAP Submissions: Do the Right Thing.

Did you know that US Copyright Law states that composers must receive a royalty when their work is performed? ASCAP protects the rights of its members by licensing and distributing royalties for the performances of copyrighted works.

ASCAP members make their living writing music, many of whom are also MTAC members. ASCAP exists to ensure that music creators are paid when their works are performed publicly. Rental or purchase of sheet music does not authorize its public performance.

MTAC has an ASCAP Copyright License, and covers each and every MTAC member for all branch and individual performances. However, in order for ASCAP members to receive royalties from the performances of their works, we must submit programs to the state office. This is where I need your help.

Throughout the 2020-2021 season, I'll collect TWO copies of each program and send them to the MTAC state office on June 30. As a reminder, these can be studio recitals, masterclasses, festival, and any other performances.

For the convenience of our branch members, there are several ways to submit your programs:

- 1. Send them to or drop them off at my home: Caitlin Boruch, 1258 Rotella Street in Newbury Park, CA 91320.
- 2. Give them to me if you see me in any capacity (MTAC festivals, performances, around town). It is the responsibility of the festival chairs to turn in the programs, but at the festivals where my students perform, I'm happy to arrange to pick up the two copies of every performance.
- 3. Collect them throughout the season and hand them to me at the MTAC luncheon and general meeting in May.
- 4. Email them in PDF format to caitlinwb@gmail.com

Thank you for your help in ensuring our composers collect the income they have earned.

What's new for 2020- 2021 year?

The application period for the state VOCE auditions will be open from November 1, 2020 through December 1, 2020. All applications need to be created by December 1. Teachers can edit unpaid applications through December 15, 2020. Branch VOCE is open until January 15, 2021.

The student's age does need to be verified before a payment can be made. Parents will have until December 15, 2020 to submit a payment. Edits to applications cannot be made after the payment has been made.

I have missed you all and hope you are all well. I have been asked by Debbie Siemer to prepare a book and DVD review for your pleasure.....these are my favorites and have kept me inspired and entertained especially at night. Here goes:

Books first:

The Piano Shop on the Left Bank by Thad Carhart All about rediscovering one's love of music and the piano in particular. Story takes place in Paris.....a local piano shop reveals the mysteries and magic of treasured instruments.

The Children of Willesdon Lane by Mona Golabek All about her mother Lisa Jura who at 16 came to England during WW ll to escape the horrors of war. This is a true story all about the power of one's dedication to music.

The Lost Pianos of Siberia by Sophy Roberts Acclained journalist Sophy Roberts makes a sweeping journey through one of the harshest landscapes on earth where pianos reveal the deep humanity and rich history of Siberia. Many wonderful photographs included.

Now for the DVD reviews:

Leonard Bernstein's Young Peoples Concerts 77 episodes featuring master teacher Bernstein and the New York Philharmonic teaching on many varied musical subjects. He is brilliant, engaging, every episode so well prepared. Most in black and white (60's 70's) some in color. Some 5000 children and adults attended these events over a 20 year period. Very suitable to share with your students.....wide range of subjects. Vol. 1...2....3.

Gustavo Dudamel and L.A. Philharmonic at Hollywood Bowl.....Tango Under the Stars......a concert featuring music of Piazolla, Ginastera and Lalo Schifrin's new guitar concerto performed by Angel Romero. Fantastic!

Gustavo Dudamel and L.A. Philharmonic at Disney Hall with Juan Diego Flores singing Rossini arias and several fabulous numbers by latin composers. Fabulous!

The Cleveland Orchestra Centennial Celebration featuring Lang Lang playing playing the Mozart Piano Concerto No. 24 so exquisitely.....he gets a wild stand ovation. Orchestra performs Richard Strauss, Johann Strauss and Ravel. The hall in Cleveland is gorgeous.

Lang Lang at Royal Albert Hall in England performing all solo piano for some 5000 spectators......3 Mozart Sonatas and Chopin 4 Ballades and 7 fantastic encores. The audience wanted him to keep going. He played twice that weekend. Amazing talent and energy. Note perfect too!

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Jonas Kaufman An Evening with Puccini at La Scala Opera House This concert is spectacular.....it made national news in Italy and all over the world. Brahms 4 Symphonies with Paavo Jarvi and the Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie of Bremen.....a music documentary by Christian Berger. The 4 Symphonies are painstakingly and lovingly rehearsed and performed.

Verbier Festival 20th Anniversary Concert......featuring many European artists performing various chamber music ensembles......some duo piano of Prokofieff and the 24 Preludes of Chopin arranged for various string instruments accompanied by piano. Monty Alexander does a wild piano improve of Happy Birthday. Terrific......

Verbier Festival 25th Anniversary Concert......this time with large ensembles and many high profile performers.

Outstanding......

Vienna Johann Strauss Orchestra A Musical Journey Across Austria.....music and great photography......gorgeous views of the Austrian landscape and many important monuments as we listen to music of the Strauss dynasty.

Now for some Dance DVD's

The Best of Riverdance narrated by Jean Butler the original female star who with Michael Flatly brought the thrill of Irish Dance to the whole world. This is a compilation of performances from various touring companies.

A new version of Riverdance has been produced and I ordered it from PBS....can't wait to see it.

La Bayadere Ballet.....at the Royal Opera House.....danced by a spectacular cast..... production by Natalia Makarova who danced the title role as a young ballerina. Music by Ludwig Minkus was very beautiful. Costumes and scenery fabulous.

ONLINE STUDIO RECITALS

REASONS FOR HAVING ONLINE RECITALS

- Serve as a performance goal for the students
- Promote a sense of musical community
- Make learning new music relevant
- Provide a sense of "closure"



2 3 TYPES OF ONLINE RECITALS

- Pre-recorded: YouTube playlist
- Pre-recorded live: YouTube list, movie, or video files shared over Zoom
- Live recital: Students perform in real time on Zoom

LIVE RECITALS

• Generate more excitement vs.

RECORDED RECITALS

- Allow for better sound quality
- • educe chances of technical difficulties
- • Give everyone a chance to listen at their leisure
- Reduce potential scheduling conflicts

TIP: SHARE COMPUTER SOUND ON ZOOM!

LIVE: STEP B Y STEP

- 1. Decide on a theme, pick and assign repertoire
- 2. Choose the date and announce it
- 3. Create a program and send it out
- 4. Schedule a meeting in zoom
- 5. Ask students to log in at least 5 minutes prior to the recital
- 6. Send a reminder
- Require better preparation from students, but less work for the teacher
- Give more opportunities for interaction
- "Force" everyone to stay and listen

3 LIVE RECITAL, CONT'D PRERECORDED LIVE: STEP BY STEP

- Make introductory comments and announcements
- State the protocol
- Announce students
- Make closing remarks
- Stay on until everyone signs off
- 1. Decide on a theme, pick and assign repertoire
- 2. Choose the date and announce it
- 3. Schedule a meeting in zoom
- 4. Ask students to log in at least 5 minutes prior to the recital
- 5. Send a reminder

COLLECTING VIDEOS

- Set a deadline (at least 2 weeks prior)
- Decide on a format:
 - YouTube link (tell parents NOT to select "made for kids") you can add their videos to your playlist
 - Video file (mp4 recommended)
- - Google drive
- Tell parents how you want videos labeled (name, title)
- Specify dress code, portrait or landscape orientation and introduction

SHARING VIDEOS:

- On Zoom:
- Make introductory remarks Share screen with videos
- Wrap up the recital
- On YouTube: Create a playlist and schedule a YouTube Premier or Create a playlist and simply send out a link for parents to watch at their leisure

4 RECITAL IDEA #1: ENGAGING STUDENTS AND ENCOURAGING INTERACTION

- Students send their recital videos ahead of time
- Teacher prepares PowerPoint presentation with questions for students during recital
- Students type their responses in the chat box
- Teacher reads answers after each performer

INTERACTIVE SUMMER RECITAL

RECITAL IDEA #2: COMPOSITION AND INDEPENDENT PROJECT

- Teacher creates groups of 3-4 students who take turns working on various steps of a composition project during lessons
- • Teacher publishes all scores as a pdf booklet and emails it out to the parents
- Compositions are played by MuseScore during the recital
- Students also play a piece they worked mostly by themselves over a 3-week period

RECITAL IDEA #4: VIRTUAL ENSEMBLE

- Compilation of audio files only in Audacity or similar app
- Compilation of video files in video editing app

4 TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL VIRTUAL RECITAL

THINGS YOU SHOULD PLAN AHEAD

EXTERNAL MICROPHONE

Use an external wired microphone and test it before using it at the recital. Wireless microphones may cause sound delays.



RECORD A TEST VIDEO

Ask a friend who lives in another location to help you run a test. Connect to zoom, have the friend record your playing, and watch the recording for things that you want to improve. Video through zoom will have different quality of sound from a video recorded on your device.



AVOID PAGE TURNS

Page turns sound loud through zoom. Make copies of *legally purchased* music and arrange all pages in front of you if you are not playing from memory.



PROPER DEVICE POSITION

Position your device to the right of the piano, slightly higher than the keyboard, and tilt the screen down to show both your face and the piano keyboard. If the device is near the bass register, the low sounding notes will be amplified and sound harsh.



A swivel bar stool with a flat seat will help you adjust height and viewing angle. A stack of books on top of a chair also works well. Practice positioning your device prior to the recital.

RIGHT BEFORE THE RECITAL:

MAKE SURE YOUR DEVICE HAS:

- · A fully charged battery
- The latest version of zoom or another application you are using
- Access to the recital link



ENABLE ORIGINAL SOUND

When in zoom, enable original sound function. Go to: Audio Settings -> Advanced -> Check "Show in meeting option to Enable Original Sound."



STOP ALL OTHER STREAMING

Ask family members to stop all video streaming from other devices. Connect to a TV screen for family watching on one device.



DRESS UP

It's easy to forget you are being watched by others when you are playing in the comfort of your own home!



BE EARLY AND TEST

Connect at least 5 minutes prior to start of the recital and test your microphone and speakers in zoom.



MUTE AND UNMUTE

Don't forget to mute yourself upon entry into the zoom meeting and unmute yourself for your performance.

Mute yourself again after performance.



SPEAK INTO THE MICROPHONE

Come closer to the device when speaking. Even if piano sound comes through well, sometimes the voice doesn't, so speaking into the device microphone is important.



...and remember - you may inspire others to do their best and learn new music.
