ASCAP Submissions: Do the Right Thing.

Did you know that US Copyright Law states that composers must receive a royalty when their work is performed? ASCAP protects the rights of its members by licensing and distributing royalties for the performances of copyrighted works.

ASCAP members make their living writing music, many of whom are also MTAC members. ASCAP exists to ensure that music creators are paid when their works are performed publicly. Rental or purchase of sheet music does not authorize its public performance.

MTAC has an ASCAP Copyright License, and covers each and every MTAC member for all branch and individual performances. However, in order for ASCAP members to receive royalties from the performances of their works, we must submit programs to the state office. This is where I need your help.

Throughout the 2019-2020 season, I'll collect TWO copies of each program and send them to the MTAC state office on June 30. As a reminder, these can be studio recitals, masterclasses, festival, and any other performances.

For the convenience of our branch members, there are several ways to submit your programs:

- 1. Send them to or drop them off at my home: Caitlin Boruch, 1258 Rotella Street in Newbury Park, CA 91320.
- 2. Give them to me if you see me in any capacity (MTAC festivals, performances, around town). It is the responsibility of the festival chairs to turn in the programs, but at the festivals where my students perform, I'm happy to arrange to pick up the two copies of every performance.
- 3. Collect them throughout the season and hand them to me at the MTAC luncheon and general meeting in May.

Certificate of Merit Branch Honors Recital Information. Saturday, April 10 and Sunday, April 11,

Dear Teachers,

We'd like to clarify a couple of things regarding various Honors as per new regulations.

- 1. <u>Memorization</u> has always been a requirement and remains a requirement for Honors Recital. All students must play a piece that is well-prepared and memorized. Please do not submit unmemorized pieces via Honors Recital Application form.
- 2. There are three different categories of Honors that a student can earn. Each has <u>a different</u> <u>set of criteria</u>. Please review carefully before you apply:

STATE HONORS: this means a sticker on a certificate of merit.

Technique: Good or ExcellentSight Reading: Good or Excellent

- Repertoire: Good or Excellent

- Theory: 80% or above

BLUE RIBBON: this means a student gets a ribbon along with the certificate:

- Technique: Good or Excellent

- Sight Reading: Average, Good or Excellent

- Repertoire: Good or Excellent

- Theory: 80% or above

HONORS RECITAL: this means a student is allowed to PLAY or submit their VIDEO for Honors Recital:

Technique: Good or ExcellentSight Reading: Good or Excellent

Signt Reading: Good or Excellent

- Theory: 80% or above

We'd like to remind all teachers about a theory requirement: **it must be 80%** or above for all Honors.

Thank you for participating in the recital! Early submissions will be much appreciated!

We are very excited to announce CM Honors Recital 2021! Sign up!

Our students worked really hard under very unusual circumstances and they deserve to be celebrated!

This year the recital will be virtual. Below you will find detailed information about the event itself, different formats and registration deadlines.

Strings and Piano will hold Honors Recital together, while Woodwinds will hold their own Honors Recital.

Please note that there are two different application forms: one for non-panel CM students and one for Panel applicants.

1. RECITAL FORMAT AND TIMELINE

This year, we are proposing two modes of Honors Recital: a live zoom recital and a YouTube Playlist. The recitals will take place on Saturday, April 10 and Sunday, April 11. YouTube Playlist will be published by 11:59pm on Friday, April 9 and can be viewed at any time online with the link. Students may choose either of the two formats based on their personal preference or teacher's preference. Please indicate the preferred mode for each student entry when you fill out the application form.

2. CRITERIA FOR HONORS:

For pianists, the branch honors blue ribbon criteria will be 80% or higher on theory; Excellent/Good

on technical requirements; Excellent/Good/Average on Sight Reading; Excellent/Good on Repertoire.

For pianists, the branch honors recital will be open to those who receive:

80% or higher on theory;

Excellent/Good on technical requirement;

Excellent/Good on Sight Reading;

Excellent on Repertoire.

? Winds, strings and voice will each decide their own criteria for Branch Honors Recital. ?

Please note that this year, the teacher will choose the piece that will be used for the Branch Honors Recital.

3. APPLICATION FORMS AND DEADLINES:

You can use the links below to fill out application forms for your students who qualify. All student results will be confirmed, so please make sure you check all evaluation results for accuracy.

For Panel piano students the criteria will be:

80% or higher on theory;

Excellent/Good on technical requirements;

Excellent/Good on Repertoire.

All applications are due on April 3 at 11:59pm. For students who choose a prerecorded option, the deadline for video submission is the same date.

NO LATE ENTRIES OR VIDEOS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Recital programs will be distributed via email prior to the recitals.

4. VIDEO SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

There is a way to label the video itself, and there is a way to change the title in YouTube.

- 1. To label the video itself (optional):
- right click on the video icon,
- select "Rename" from the drop down menu,
- delete the old title (it will be highlighted)
- type in the new title in this order: Teacher branch number, Student last name, Student first name,

Title of piece, Composer's first and last name, Opus number and Movement

- 2. To change the title in YouTube (mandatory): see attached instructions for uploading a video in YouTube, including changing its title. Please note that if you label the video file itself, YouTube will automatically assign that title to the video. In other words, you only need to do it once: either by labeling the video file or by changing the title of YouTube video.
- 3. There is no need to put any information in the body of the email, since the videos will be labeled, and corresponding forms will also contain all the required information. The email from the teachers only needs to contain the links and the SUBJECT LINE as described.

Videos should be submitted via a YouTube link. Please make sure the video is NOT marked "made for kids". Videos may be uploaded on either the teacher's or parent's YouTube channel. When you click on a "SHARE" button under each video, choose "COPY" and insert that link into your email for submission.

All email communication must be titled "Video Submissions for Honors Recital" and go to Katya Solovskaya at pianowithkatya@gmail.com. All submissions must come from the teachers, preferably but not necessarily in one email. Please do not ask parents to send their video submissions directly to us.

It is the teacher's choice which of the student's CM videos to submit.

Please follow Katya's and Debbie's instructions for uploading the video to YouTube. The students/parents can do this.

When choosing availability, choose "unlisted", not public.

Make sure that the video is not categorized as "made for kids."

Each video should be labeled with the following information:

Eligibility

CA announces vaccine eligibility expansion starting in April:

- The State of California has announced plans to expand vaccine eligibility to people 50 years and older starting April 1, and to people 16 years and older starting April 15.
- Kaiser Permanente welcomes this expansion in eligibility. We're currently preparing for this expansion and will be sharing updates on kp.org/ covidvaccine.
- We have increased our capacity to deliver more vaccine doses at our own facilities as well as in multiple mass vaccination hubs across the state.
- We're not able to preschedule appointments in advance of these eligibility dates.
- Please also keep in mind that our ability to accommodate all who will now be eligible is dependent on Kaiser Permanente receiving enough vaccine supply.

We're currently providing COVID-19 vaccine appointments to:

- People 65 and older, residents and workers in high-risk congregate settings, and essential workers in agriculture, child care, education, emergency services, food, health care, and public transit. For a complete list of essential workers who qualify for a vaccine in this phase, please visit the California state website.

Advanced Contemporary Music Festival 2021 Preview

This announcement may seem early, but as CM is behind us, some teachers may be planning for next school year. Therefore, I would like to put the words out.

ACMF 2021 will be held in October tentatively. All disciplines, level 5 and above, are welcomed. There is no confirmation whether it will be virtual or live at this point. When choosing repertoire for students, please consider the followings:

- 1. Eligiblecomposers'deathdatesmustbewithinthelast100years.
- 2. Music must display contemporary composition techniques and styles. Music using Romantic idioms are strongly discouraged. More information can be found on the branch website in the teachers portal.
- 3. Music must be level 5 and above.
- 4. Not all the pieces listed in the CM syllabus are eligible for this festival.

We implemented the "Repertoire Approval Process" last year, and found it beneficial in avoiding last-minute changes or drop of entries. We will continue to offer the service this year from April till registration deadline in September.

Repertoire Approval Process:

The "Not Allowed Composers List" is included below. The document can also be found on our branch website www.mtacconejovalley.org. Teachers are encouraged to email Emily Wu (emywu15@gmail.com) to verify eligibility of their potential music choice. Ineligible pieces will result in automatic disqualification from the festival in October 2021.

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
